School Targets for 2007-08:

- A. Improvement of instruction for EL students
- B. Meeting the needs of each student in the area of math instruction
- C. Continue to develop a professional learning community focused on meeting the learning needs of each student.

School Achievements 2007-08:

- Earned an Academic Performance Index Growth Score (API) of 954.
- 91% of Canyon View students in English Language Arts and 93% in Mathematics scored at the proficient or advanced levels in the 2007 California Standards Tests.
- Received the California Distinguished School Award for a second time.
- Honored a Canyon View teacher as the IUSD Elementary Teacher of the Year.
- Utilized regular analysis of grade level Common Assessments, Literacy Performance Assessment data, IOLA assessment data and IUSD Writing Assessments to inform instructional decisions in core curricular areas.
- Continued our work as a Professional Learning Community to monitor student learning, adjust instruction based on student achievement data, and provide interventions for students based on individual need.
- Fully implemented Early Intervention Reading Model (EIRM) in grades K-2.
- Created before and after school intervention and extended learning opportunities.
- Continued Information Resource Center and grade-level collaboration to develop integrated, technology-based problem-solving units focused on essential questions.
- Awarded two IPSF Grants for purchase of Physical Education equipment and a document camera.
- Continued implementation of student-led Video Production Studio to produce weekly school broadcasts through our Star Cam program.
- Logged more than 21,000 parent volunteer hours.
- Augmented fine arts instruction with PTA-sponsored Art Masters program for K-6 and classroom music lessons for grades K-3.
- Partnered with PTA to continue “Math-to-Achieve” and “Reading Counts” Incentive Programs K-6.
- Continued school wide participation in the Pacific Symphony’s Class Act Program.
- Continued IPSF ACE program which featured about 10 classes in each of the fall and winter sessions with a total of 275 students participating.
- Held our first Jog-a-Thon and raised over \$55,000.00 through PTA to support ongoing programs.
- Hosted our first “Taste of Canyon View” which brought together our diverse cultures for an afternoon of food, music, dance and games.
- Purchased and installed LCD projectors and audio enhancement systems in every classroom, science room, and the IRC.
