

FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

DEAR NEIGHBOR,

Last year, I communicated with you about the Irvine Unified School District's (IUSD) aging schools, many of which are more than 30 years old, and the District's need to pass a bond measure to provide a locally-controlled funding source for the most urgent upgrades. In June 2016, Irvine voters answered this call and reaffirmed their commitment to IUSD schools and students by passing Measure E.

Measure E will provide the District with a maximum available bond issuance of \$319 million for facilities improvements at 28 of the District's aging schools. Funding is currently planned to be issued in four series over 12 years, which will enable IUSD to efficiently and effectively manage complex projects and resources. Funding for the first series is \$95 million. The first projects in Series I are underway at six elementary schools. All six schools will be open and ready to serve students prior to the start of the 2017-18 school year.

What this means for IUSD and Irvine residents is exciting. Measure E funds will ensure that all of IUSD's more than 33,000 students will have access to 21st century instructional technology and learning tools. Bringing all schools up to a similar standard will protect the outstanding quality of education for which IUSD schools are known, helping to keep home values strong across the entire district. In addition, most of the high schools and middle schools serving graduates



Planned upgrades for IUSD's older schools include facility and technology infrastructure modernizations. Projects will focus on improvements to classrooms, science labs and high school theaters, the creation of collaborative learning spaces, the development of innovation labs, interior doors for many elementary school classrooms, better accessibility and other upgrades to improve safety, comfort and the learning environment for students. In the year since voters passed Measure E, the District has been hard at work planning, preparing and implementing Measure E projects. IUSD staff has conducted thorough assessments of all projects in Series I, on 21 campuses, and in conjunction with school staff and with parent input has identified and prioritized the most urgent facility improvements and upgrades for this first series. In addition, the District held a series of public information meetings for the community. IUSD staff also presented Measure E plans to the Board of Education at several Board Meetings and during two Facilities Study Sessions.

To keep Irvine residents informed, IUSD has developed this newsletter, which is also available at *iusd.org/MeasureE*, to provide a general Measure E update, highlight the six projects taking place this summer, provide information about the Citizens Oversight Committee, and ensure residents know how to stay connected with IUSD for Measure E updates.

Thank you for your interest in IUSD schools and for your continuing support. Together, we can ensure our students are prepared for competitive 21st century college and career opportunities.

CITIZENS OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

BOARD APPOINTED COMMITTEE

In accordance with California state law, for measures passed with 55 percent of the vote, IUSD's Board of Education appointed a Citizens Oversight Committee (COC) during the September 13, 2016 Board Meeting. The COC's role is to monitor bond expenditures and ensure bond revenues are allocated in compliance with the voter approved measure. The focus of the committee is to provide transparency and maintain public confidence in the use of Measure E bond funds.

COMMITTEE REQUIREMENTS

COC members must commit to a two-year term of service and reside or own property within the School Facilities Improvement District (SFID) boundaries (see map on back cover). Membership is voluntary, without compensation and members must be at least 18 years of age. Employees, vendors, contractors, consultants, or IUSD officials are not eligible for appointment to the Committee.

The California State Education Code requires a minimum of seven (7) members representing the following categories:

- One (1) member who is a parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the District within the boundaries of the SFID
- One (1) member who is both a parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the District within the boundaries of the SFID and active in a parentteacher organization, such as the PTA or School Site Council
- One (1) member who is active in a business organization representing the business community
- One (1) member who is active in a senior citizens organization
- One (1) member who is active in a bona-fide taxpayers association
- **Two (2) members** of the community at-large

After careful consideration and based on their respective qualifications and interview, staff recommended 11 candidates for appointment to the independent Measure E Citizens Oversight Committee. In early 2017, the District announced that three schools will be temporarily relocated for one year to an interim campus, due to the extensive work that will be done on these school sites:


