Special Presentation

Superintendent Search Process

California School Boards Association Advisor William Diedrich reviewed his background and qualifications and provided an overview of the Superintendent Search proposal offered by CSBA. Mr. Larry Maw was also introduced, a new member of the CSBA Executive Search Services team.

Mr. Diedrich reviewed approximate time lines, recruitment strategies, advertising resources, screening procedures, opportunities for community/staff input, the specific roles of both the Board and CSBA, and proposed expenses. He advised that the process would be tailor-made to meet the District's specifications and would be implemented with a high level of integrity and confidentiality.

The Board expressed a desire for maximum stakeholder input and a national search focus. Areas of concern were discussed, including advisor availability due to concurrent assignments and the possibility of a revision to the first year guarantee to exclude "under the same governing board" in light of the 2005 board election.

After reaching consensus, the Board directed staff to enter into an agreement with CSBA for the Superintendent Search Process.
