## Impact of Bonita Canyon Planning Area 26 on Enrollment at University High School

President Adler presented an historical overview of the Planning Area 26 issue and read the Board's statement from the Special Meeting of January 6, 1997. Paul Reed provided a report on the current status of the deannexation issue.

The Board expressed appreciation for the longstanding partnership between the City and school district and reported on the rationale used for the deannexation decision. The Board reiterated their resolve that the City should honor their word and move forward with approval of the

deannexation of Planning Area 26. The Board encouraged community members and students to attend the City Council meeting on January 27, 1998.

Student Members Chung and Tsai expressed their support for the deannexation of Planning Area 26, citing the overcrowded conditions at UHS and WHS.

# Designation of Official School Site for Bonita Canyon Planning Area 26

Paul Reed provided the background and rationale for staff's recommendation to designate Planning Area 26B as the preferred site to serve Bonita Canyon should the jurisdictional transfer fail.

Member Wakeham requested Paul Reed to determine whether P.A. 26B and C has already been transferred to the City of Newport Beach.

Then, on the motion of Member Wakeham, seconded by Member Regele and carried, the Board designated the site in Planning Area 26B as IUSD's preferred site to serve Bonita Canyon if it becomes necessary for IUSD to serve the area.

# RESOLUTION NO. 97-98-18: Marine Corps Air Station - El Toro Reuse Plan
