## 1. Culverdale and Westpark Village Schools

Open Westpark Elementary on a year-round calendar beginning July, 1991 serving students in kindergarten through fifth grade. Westpark Elementary will serve the following neighborhoods:

Westpark Village

Culverdale

IUSD portion of the Irvine Business Complex

(West of Jamboree between McGaw and the I-405)

MCAS Tustin Base housing south of Dulay and north of Barranca

Culverdale Elementary, with the augmented capacity of the San Leandro facility on its campus, will continue to serve the following neighborhoods:

Culverdale

Westpark Village

IUSD portion of the Irvine Business Complex

(West of Jamboree between McGaw and the I-405).

MCAS Tustin Base housing south of Dulay and north of Barranca.

## 2. Northwood Village Schools

Continue to guarantee new enrollees between Irvine Boulevard and A.T.S.F. right of way, a seat at Westwood. Alternately, they may enroll at Santiago Hills or Northwood.

Remove all Open Enrollment restrictions previously imposed on the elementary schools in North Irvine (North of the Santa Ana Freeway), with the understanding that busing will not be provided.

## 3. Woodbridge Village Schools

To preserve capacity for students residing within the Meadow Park attendance area, continue Meadow Park as closed to Open Enrollment.

To provide long term space for neighborhood children at Springbrook, continue Springbrook as closed to Open Enrollment for students outside of South Woodbridge.

## 4. Turtle Rock Village Schools

To preserve capacity at Turtle Rock beginning Fall 1991, reassign students residing in the developments in Enclave 7, from Turtle Rock Elementary to Bonita Canyon Elementary.

Establish that all students who reside in the housing at UC Irvine are assigned to Turtle Rock Elementary.

Establish that all students who will reside in the housing planned on the Christ College property will be assigned to University Park Elementary.

Action on Deerfield program assignments will be taken during the June 20, 1991 Regular Meeting of the Board. In the interim, staff is directed to meet with CAC parents and AAPAS parents to obtain feedback on the following proposal:

1. Move the K-2, and 3-4 SDC classes to Alderwood Basics Plus.
2. Explore the possibility of keeping the 5-6 SDC class at Deerfield for one more year.
3. Consider not forming a third grade AAPAS class at Deerfield.
