- 1. The Board, acting as both the governing body of the Community Facilities District 86-1, and the IUSD Board, representing the State Allocation Board, State of California, approved the District's expenditure of \$3,012,500.00, Agreement For Sale and Purchase of Land, Corporate Grant Deed, Declaration of Special Land Use Restrictions, and adopted the Resolution of Acceptance (Resolution No. 91/92-5), for the acquisition of the Northwood 5 Elementary School site.
- 2. The Board, acting as the governing body of Community Facilities District No. 85-1, authorized the Deputy Superintendent, Business Services, to extend the contract with Mr. David King for the provision of consultant services in construction litigation matters in the amount of \$5,000, for a total not to exceed \$12,500.
- 3. The Board, acting as the governing body of Community Facilities District 86-1, authorized award of a contract for repairs to Relocatable Units at the Woodbridge Auxiliary Education Site in the amount of \$44,000 to Southern California Builders.
- 4. The Board, acting as the Legislative Body of Community Facilities District No. 86-1, authorized an additional \$7,500 to cover expenses incurred by the landscape architectural firm The Dike Partnership for the Windrow Community Park Project.

The Board reviewed the draft of the vandalism policy and directed staff to do the following:

Add a philosophy statement, in the introduction, stressing the Board's abhorrence of vandalism.

Hold further discussions with high school principals and student representatives to discuss the possibility of adding guidelines to the policy relative to specific consequences, a reward strategy option, service opportunities for offenders, and students/parents assuming indirect costs of vandalism.

Reagendize the item in November.

President Cameron called a recess at 9:05 p.m. The meeting reconvened at 9:15 p.m.

The Board directed staff to provide follow-up communication on the issue of athletic transportation.
