Education Advisory Committee Business

• **Calm Classroom Activity** - Stan Machesky led the committee through a calming and centering activity used in our elementary schools.

Presentation / GradeSlam - 24/7 Online Tutoring Support

The GradeSlam team presented an overview of what GradeSlam is and how our students, teachers, and administrators can utilize this new tool.

- Students access their tutor through a chat format with access to a whiteboard tool for math problems and photo upload to share an assignment or rubric
- Annotated essay review within 24 hours

- Review essay and provide feedback
- Check essay for plagiarism
- Ability to upload the rubric for the tutor
- Insight for teachers
 - Daily feedback shared with teachers about usage
 - Information shared about what questions students are asking
- Tutors are GradeSlam employees not freelance tutors
 - GradeSlam provides training
- Full transparency
 - Every session and essay on the platform is available to the administrator
 - Dedicated support team for IUSD
- Demonstration provided for Math and Essay tutoring session
- Opportunity for students to practice their digital citizenship
- Common Barriers for students
 - Confidence in their own ability
 - Not knowing how to articulate their question
 - Time
 - Remembering how to access GradeSlam
- IUSD student experience feedback shared
- Following the presentation, committee members broke into small groups to discuss the following three questions:
 - Of the information presented, what would be most valuable for our parent community to know to encourage use of the program?
 - o How might we encourage parents to support and donate toward the program?
 - What would be the best way to communicate this information?
- Responses will be compiled and shared with committee members: Feedback
- Roundtable Discussion: EAC member S. Lester shared her appreciation for the
 GradeSlam presentation and the opportunity to close the inequality gap regarding
 tutoring. T. Walker shared recent updates on COVID-19 and assured everyone that the
 District is working closely with local agencies and will continue to send updated
 communication to the IUSD community as we receive it. EAC member M. Genest
 expressed concern about students in 7th grade taking the California Healthy Youth
 Survey. He also asked for clarification on notification to parents prior to students taking
 the survey.
