• Grading Practices That Support Student Learning

Catherine Holmes, Executive Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Professional Learning and Alyssa McCanne, Coordinator Data & Assessment presented an overview IUSD's shift to Standards Based Grading.

- We are missing the mark
- What is the most important thing that a grade needs to convey
- Grading True North Efficacy and Accuracy
- Standards Based Mindset
- Give Students Full Credit for what they know

- Zero on the 100 Point Scale
- Averaging: The Mean Can Be Mean
- Reassessment
- Redefining Our Homework as Practice
- Redefine Responsibility
- Examining Our Practices
 - Heather Phillips, Director of Literacy, explained what professional learning for our teachers will look like moving forward to support this shift.
 - Chris Weber, Director of STEM, described the work of District staff, site Administrators, and site PLC Facilitator coaches to train and support teachers in this shift.

Question and Answer:

- O Cathryn Mah asked about the timing for implementation and what will the communication to parents be about this shift?
- O Has there been buy in from Universities?
- O Regarding transcripts will the weight of each letter grade remain the same?
- Kevork Abazajian mentioned that this shift is also happening at the University level.
- O Naveed Siddiqui At the teacher level this is going to take a lot of work. Do we have an example of where this has already worked?
 - Lynzi Gorzycki, Woodbridge High School math teacher, shared what the WHS math department is doing regarding their shift to standards based grading.
 - Christina Masciel, Jeffrey Trail Middle School social science teacher, described some of the challenges teachers face with this shift and how they are working through them.
 - Mike Genest asked if students feel like they are falling behind on other parts of math when they are spending time relearning and reassessing missed learning targets?
 - Beatrice Tseng-Chen asked how do teachers continue to teach new content while they are continuing to reteach missed standards?

Small Group Breakouts:

- O What do parents need to know about grading reform? What message points about grading reform would most resonate with our parent community?
 - Top three feedback ideas:
 - How can parents help?
 - It's not about 'when' learning occurs
 - Transcripts and letter grades are not going to change
- What might be the most common concerns about grading reform that our parents may have?
 - Top three feedback idea:
 - How will this impact high school transcripts for college?

- Parents may not understand / may be confused by a new system (ex. 1-5)
- Will students have equity when transferring in to high school? Into middle school? All transitions within a school?
- What are the best methods and strategies to communicate with our community about grading reform?
 - Top three feedback ideas:
 - Information night
 - Continual exposure
 - Via students

- O What is the assimilation process to navigate school as a new or immigrant student, parent engagement and how does IUSD embrace diversity across our district?
- O Student to teacher ratio what is happening moving forward?
