FREE BUS PASS APPLICATION PROCESS AND LIST OF REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

After indicating the intent to apply for a Free Bus Pass on the Bus Pass Application, applicant will receive an email with the APPLICATION FOR FREE BUS PASS 2025-26.
Applicant must provide a copy of their 2024 1040 Federal Income Tax Form return <u>including</u> a copy of the W-2.
Applicant must provide four (4) current paycheck stubs for each working adult in the household.
Return complete APPLICATION FOR FREE BUS PASS 2025-26 and supporting documentation by email to BusPass@iusd.org.
IF YOU DID NOT FILE A 2024 FEDERAL INCOME TAX FORM, PROOF OF THE FOLLOWING IS REQUIRED:
Current bank statement (4 months).
Letter from your employer stating your hourly rate of pay and the total number of hours per week worked (must be on official business letterhead).
If you are unemployed, a letter from the Employment Development Department (EDD) that verifies the amount you are awarded monthly.
State of California Benefit ID Card (Medical) and current print-out of eligibility from doctor's office.
Evidence of child support.
Current Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) Notice of Action or print-out verifying 12 months of income.

NOTE: A Bus Pass Application, Application for Free Bus Pass 2025-26, and the above-listed income verification documentation must be received by the Transportation Department to secure a seat on the bus and generate a bus pass for your student. For safety reasons, beginning the first day of school, only students with current 2025-26 bus passes will be permitted to ride.

DEFINITIONS OF TERMS IN THE CHART

Household Size is the number of people in your household. A household is any group of related or non-related individuals, (Parents, children, grandparents, aunts, uncles, roommates, etc.) who are living as one economic unit. They share living expenses including rent, clothing, food, utility bills, etc.. A foster child is considered a one-member household if the welfare placement agency maintains legal responsibility for the foster child.

<u>Gross Income</u> is total household income <u>before</u> deductions. It includes wages, welfare payments, food stamp allotments, pensions, Social Security, S.S.I., child support, alimony, income from investments, and all other income for all members of the household.
