ELEMENTARY TEACHER - MUSIC (GENERAL, INSTRUMENTAL OR CHORAL)

DEFINITION:

Under general supervision, teaches one or more classes In the field of music to students in grades K through 6, assist In other school programs as assigned, and creates a flexible program and environment favorable to learning and personal growth In accordance with each students' ability.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES include the following. Other duties may be assigned.

- Teaches knowledge and skills In the field of music, which may include general, instrumental or choral
 music to elementary students utilizing the course of study prescribed by the District approved
 curriculum.
- Instructs students in citizenship and basic subject matter specified in state law and administrative regulations and procedures of the school district.
- Provides instruction by which students develop aesthetic concepts and appreciations and the ability to make qualitative judgments about music.
- Recruits students to receive instruction In playing standard band and orchestra instruments.
- Develops instructional plans and organizes class time to provide a balanced program of instruction, demonstration, and working time.
- Provides individual and small group instruction in order to adapt the curriculum to the needs of pupils
 with varying intellectual and artistic abilities, and to accommodate a variety of instructional activities.
 Establishes and maintains standards of pupil behavior required to provide an orderly and productive
 studio environment.
- Instructs students in proper care and use of instruments and equipment and organizes storage areas and control use of materials and instruments to prevent loss or abuse.
- Evaluates each student's performance and growth in knowledge and aesthetic understanding; and prepares progress report.
- Selects and requisitions instructional materials, books, instruments, etc., and maintains inventory reports.
- Maintains professional competence through in service education activities provided by the district and/or in self-selected professional growth activities.
- Participates cooperatively with the appropriate administrator to develop the method by which she/he
 will be evaluated in conformance with district guidelines.
- Communicates with parents and school counselors on student progress.
- Cooperates In school-wide supervision of students during out-of-classroom activities.
- Participates In faculty and/or District committees and the sponsorship of student activities.
