## 22. ITEMS OF BUSINESS

a. Public Hearing: Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) 2023-24 Local Plan: Annual Service Plan and Annual Budget Plan

After holding a public hearing, adopt the Irvine Unified School District SELPA 2023-24 Local Plan: Annual Service Plan and Annual Budget Plan.

## Minutes:

Melanie Hertig, the Executive Director of Special Education, presented the Irvine Unified School District Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) 2023-24 Annual Service Plan and Annual Budget Plan. She commenced by highlighting various key points from the past year, including the Abilities Awareness – Inclusion Matters event, and the rebranding of the SAI II Program to the Essentials Program, with the Mod/Server Program renamed to the Extensive Support Needs Program. Additionally, staff collaborated in professional learning activities and worked closely with the Special Education Community Advisory Committee to advocate for inclusive practices and settings.

Hertig proceeded to provide an overview of the different eligibility categories for students with disabilities and provided state statistics in comparison to Irvine's numbers. Notably, 23% of IUSD's special education population is Autism eligible, compared to the state average of 18%, and 35% of Irvine's special education students with speech and language eligibility, surpassing the state's 21% average.

She went on to list the special education staff at school sites, highlighting approximately 500 Instructional Assistants, 216 Education Specialists, and 180 Behavioral Interventionists, among others.

Furthermore, she reviewed the requirements of the Annual Budget and Services Plans, stressing that these plans must be adopted at a public hearing and detail expected expenditures, service descriptions, physical service locations, and accessibility of appropriate services and instruction for students with exceptional needs. It was emphasized that IUSD, being a single-district SELPA, has a streamlined process.

In terms of the Annual Budget Plan, Hertig indicated state revenues of nearly \$35 million, federal revenue of \$6 million, and a school district contribution of nearly \$77 million, constituting 65.2% of the total budget of nearly \$118 million. On a positive note, Special Education funding received a Cost of Living Adjustment from the state this year. She further broke down the associated expense budgets, illustrating that approximately 84% or \$99 million of the budgeted costs are allocated to staffing.

During the presentation, Board members raised questions. There was an inquiry about whether the state-funded preschool and deaf and hard of hearing (DHH) programs were part of the plan and budget. It was clarified that the state-funded preschool, being a general education program, is not included, but is integrated within Special Education. The DHH programs at Venado Middle School and University High School are county programs, and therefore are not covered in the plan. A question was also raised about staffing vacancies. Hertig responded that the department is adequately staffed in vital areas, but there are often vacancies for Instructional Assistants and Behavioral Interventionists. Member Yu requested a follow-up with a more detailed breakdown of the budget category coded as 5000.

President Brooks opened the public hearing at 7:17 p.m., received one comment from Sam Gordon and closed the public hearing at 7:33 p.m.
