Classrooms & Pods

- Main classroom buildings are two-story
 Classrooms are mostly flexible; some layouts allow for better arrangements than others, but overall function well
- •Classrooms can access outdoor areas, but not learning areas; not currently an issue
- •Inadequate number of classrooms; some pods used as classrooms
- Pods have poor acoustics, but overall, described as enhancing student learning; inadequate/small size of pods requires heavy use of media center
- •Special Ed. classrooms integrated with General Ed.
- •Need additional Music classroom; one (1) Music classroom in a portable

Library/ Media

- •Library described as great learning center with collaborative environment; large open space with nice murals
- •Library adequately supports current needs for collaboration but could use more quiet room space
- •Media Center well-equipped with latest technology

Food Service

- •Very nice facility; adequately sized and functions well for its purpose
- •Queue area could be longer/bigger

Performing Arts

- •Theater described as wonderful; no problems
- •Choral and instrumental rooms small for population; cannot accommodate ensembles

Admin & Support Spaces

- •Workrooms interspersed throughout classroom buildings function well for teachers, particularly those displaced due to room sharing; prefer to prep in classrooms
- •Workrooms "too" accessible to people, which can make difficult to work in •Counselors located in two separate buildings; prefer to be co-located •Admin Building needs additional office/counseling room; converted old conference room into principal's office; need conference space there as well

Physical Education

 Locker room and team room are small; cannot support student population
 Could benefit from small gym or larger wrestling room to accommodate
 wrestlers and teams for practice time

CAMPUS OVERVIEW

Northwood High School is one of four comprehensive high schools in the Irvine Unified School District, serving students in grades 9-12. The school is situated north of Portola Parkway, between the 261 and 133 toll roads; it is surrounded by Orchard Hills, across the street from a residential neighborhood, and not far from the Rattlesnake Reservoir.

The school is the newest of the high schools in Irvine, built in 1999. The Classroom buildings, Administration building, and Library/Media Center are oriented around a central outdoor quad area for student gathering. The classroom buildings are two stories, with outdoor walkways and views of the rest of the campus. The Administration building is adjacent to the parking lot, and Food Service is located behind it, toward the back of the campus. The campus includes an impressive, large, high-tech Performing Arts Center, an Aquatic Center, a gymnasium, sports courts, and athletic fields for physical education and outdoor sport activities.

Northwood High School emphasizes effective communication and complex thinking; students are encouraged to produce high quality work, and develop habits of healthy individuals and life-long learners, to become active participants in the community.

<u>Mission Statement</u>: "to enable all students to become contributing members of the society, empowered with the skills, knowledge, and values necessary to meet the challenges of a changing world, by providing the highest quality educational experience [the school and its stakeholders] can envision."







General Condition & Aesthetics

- •Aesthetically very pleasing and welldesigned; grounds and school are extremely well-maintained; elicits pride from community
- •Lack student work display areas
- Desire for tutoring center
- •Adding an MPR would allow for large gathering, testing, speakers, rather than utilizing the media center (which is used regularly); a large indoor space for student gathering is desired for rainy days and for banquets
- •Oak Tree is a landmark on campus •Interest in incorporating solar panels

Building Systems

•HVAC is provided by Carrier gas/electric roof top equipment that is controlled by a Carrier EMS. Equipment is in good condition

•Site does not have photovoltaic panels

Technology

•One computer lab/pod for every four classrooms; some have been converted into classrooms; currently only 3 in use •Computers in every pod, plus 3 computer labs; school is wireless and laptops available for checkout at media center •Need for more bandwidth to support heavy technology use

Outdoor Spaces, Fields, Landscaping

- •Adjacency of baseball field to tennis court presents problem with baseballs entering tennis area; new nets not catching everything
- •Would be nice to have all-weather track •Interest in having a stadium
- •Outdoor quad area provides tables for gathering and shade opportunities; areas

- adjacent to Library/Media need more shade
- •Trees and shade dispersed throughout campus, but not a lot of shade over the many seating areas scattered throughout


