• Follow up to the Questions about the Supplemental Educational tutoring (SES) This is a program from several years ago to support schools that did not meet the NCLB testing improvement markers. Since then we, as a nation, have moved together with ESSA (Every Student Successes

- Act), supporting with RTI (Response to Intervention) to meet the Common Core goals, the program offered SES,, is no longer offered. Our school district is constantly identifying students in need and supporting them to ensure that they are making growth year to year.
- Friday while our children are with us, our teachers will be learning, sharing and expanding their professional development. They will cover Universal Design in teaching and learning. They will learn alternative ways to represent work and work production, expression and how to engage students with different learning styles in different ways.
