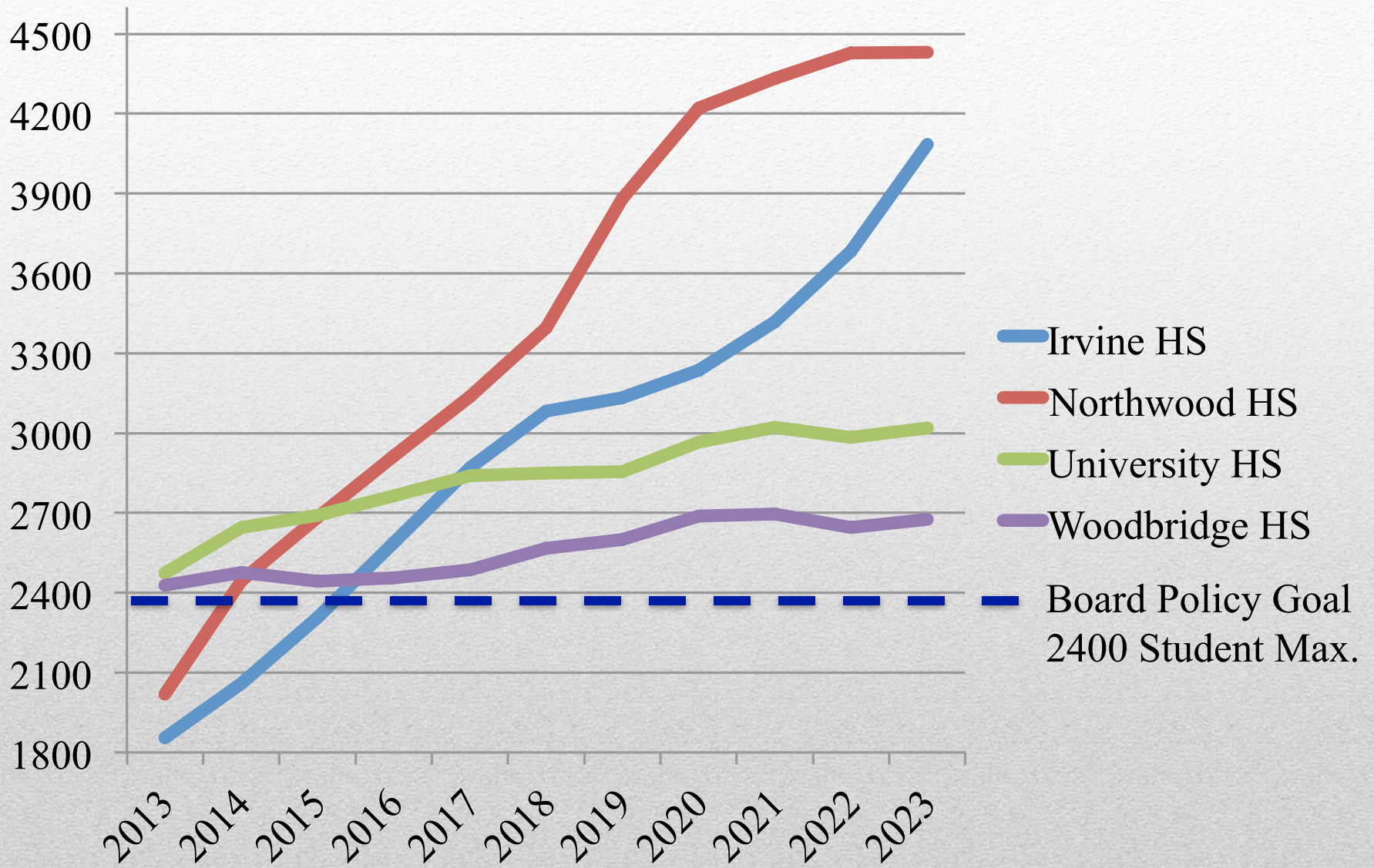

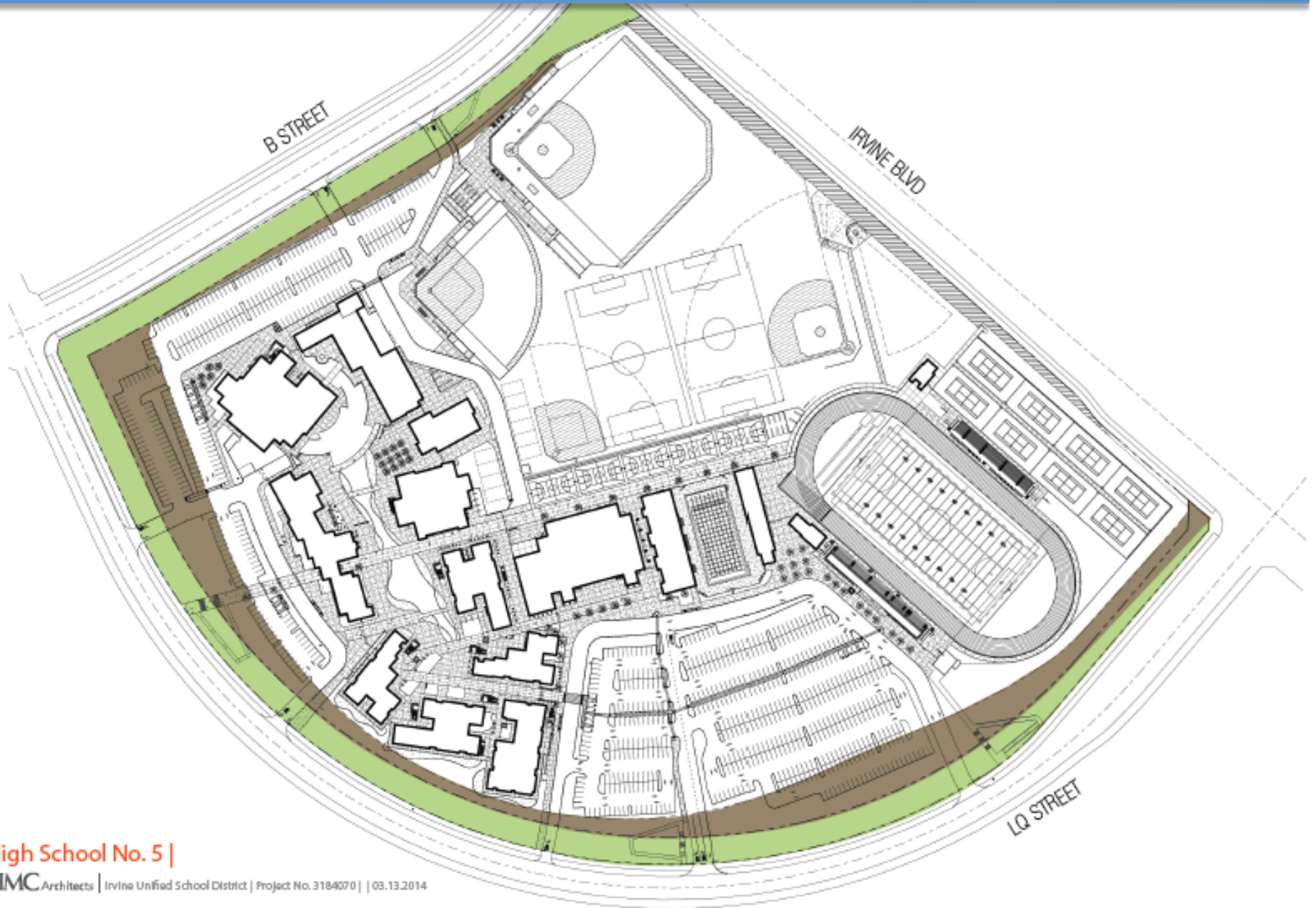
HS #5 and Balancing Student Enrollment

The Irvine Unified School District needs to create a boundary for High School #5. The district needs to maintain balanced enrollment at Irvine, Northwood, University and Woodbridge high schools by modifying school boundaries.



High School #5 is our district's fifth comprehensive high school and will serve some of the city's newer communities. It is scheduled to open near the Orange County Great Park in the fall of 2016.

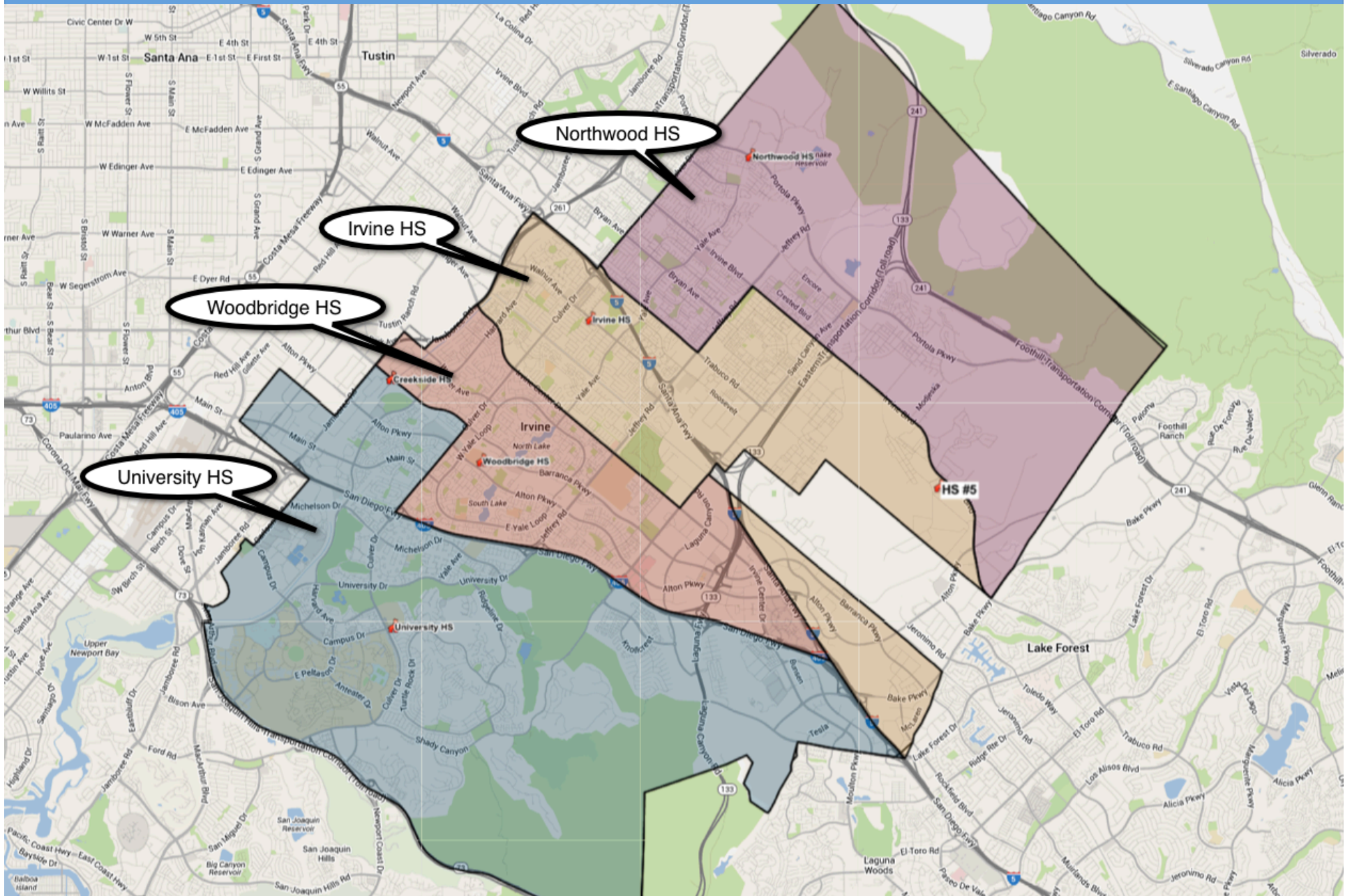

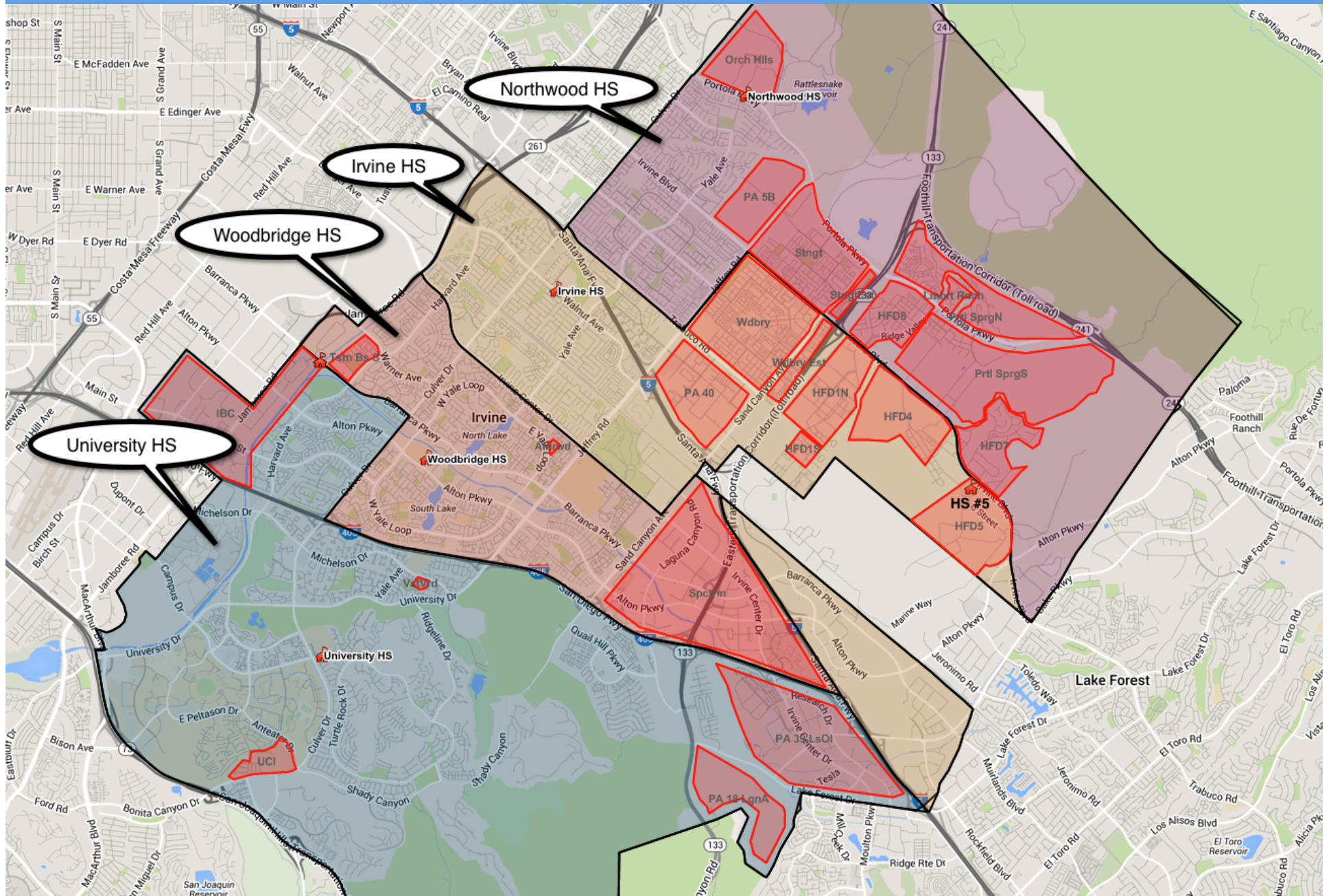

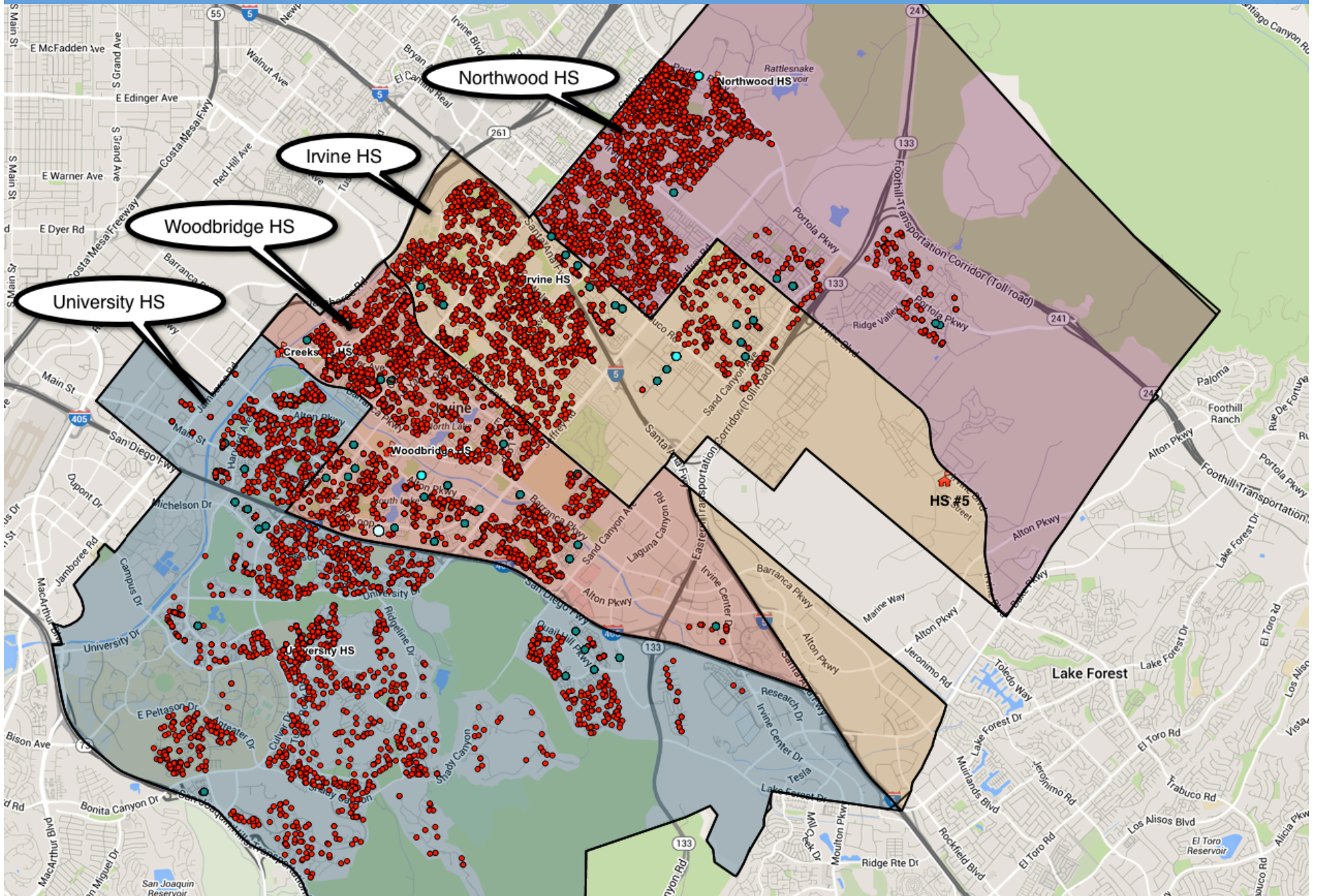
Current HS Boundaries



Current HS Boundaries with New Development

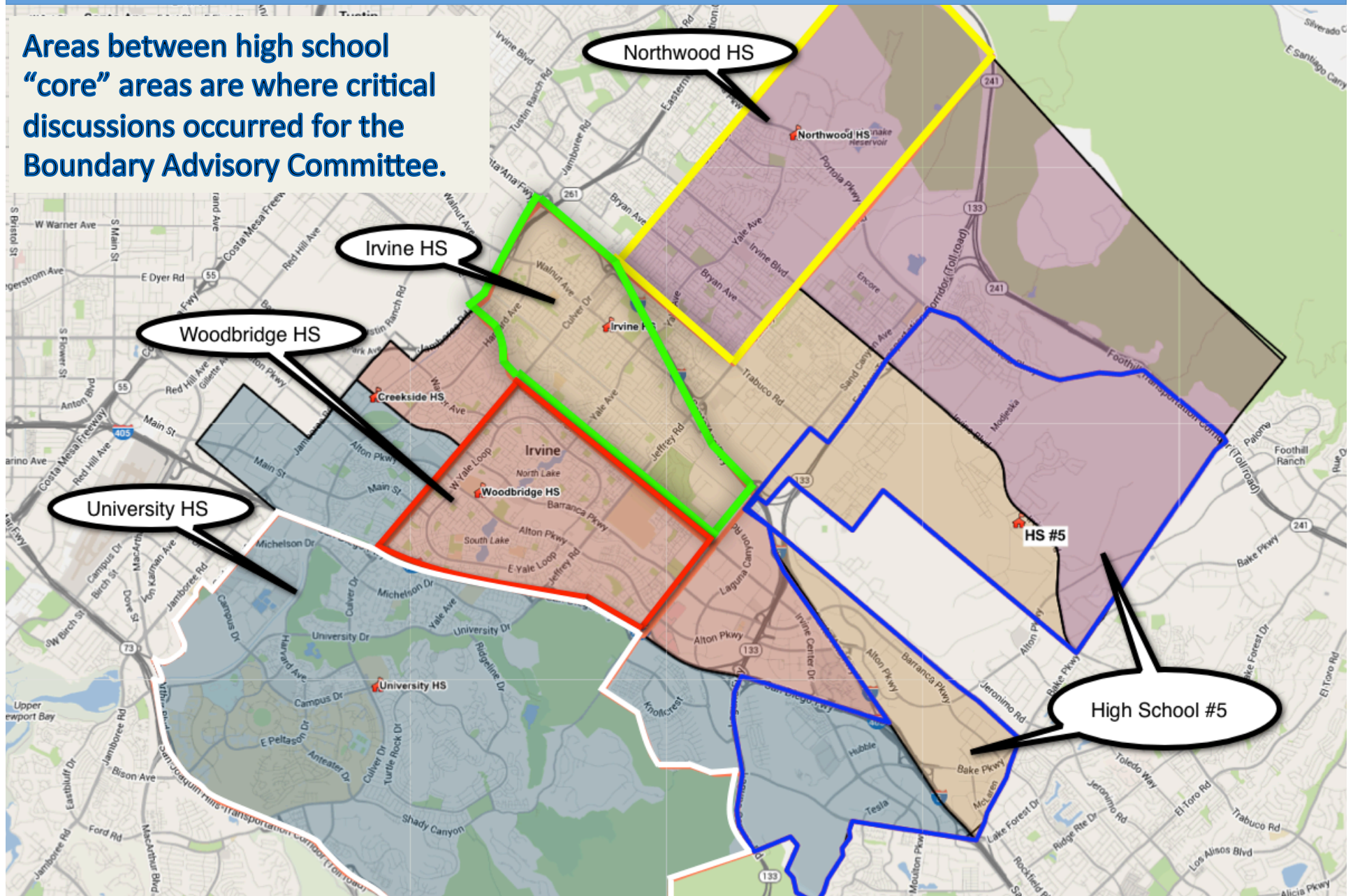


Current HS Boundaries with 9-12 Students Plotted

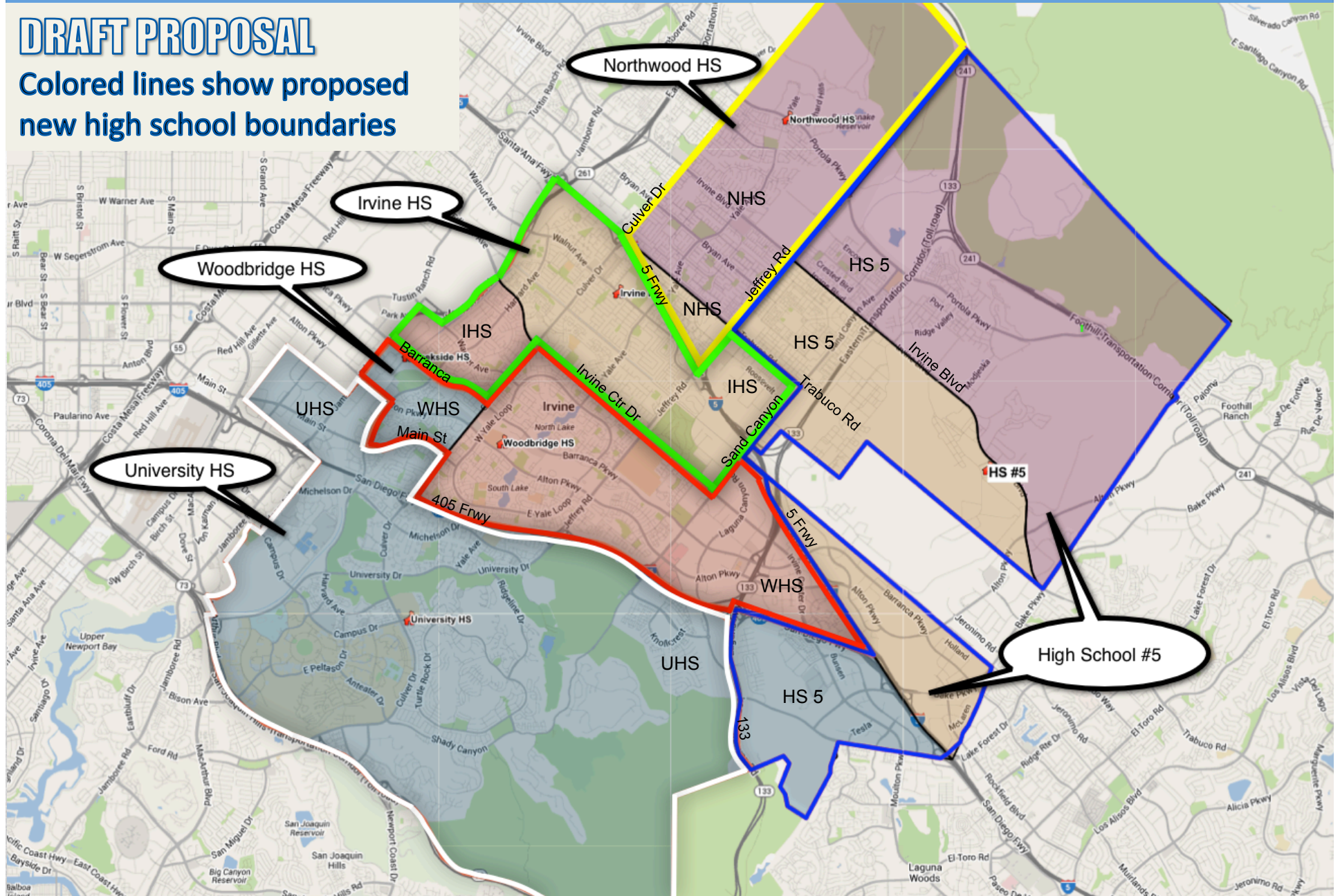

Proposed Boundaries – over Current HS Boundaries

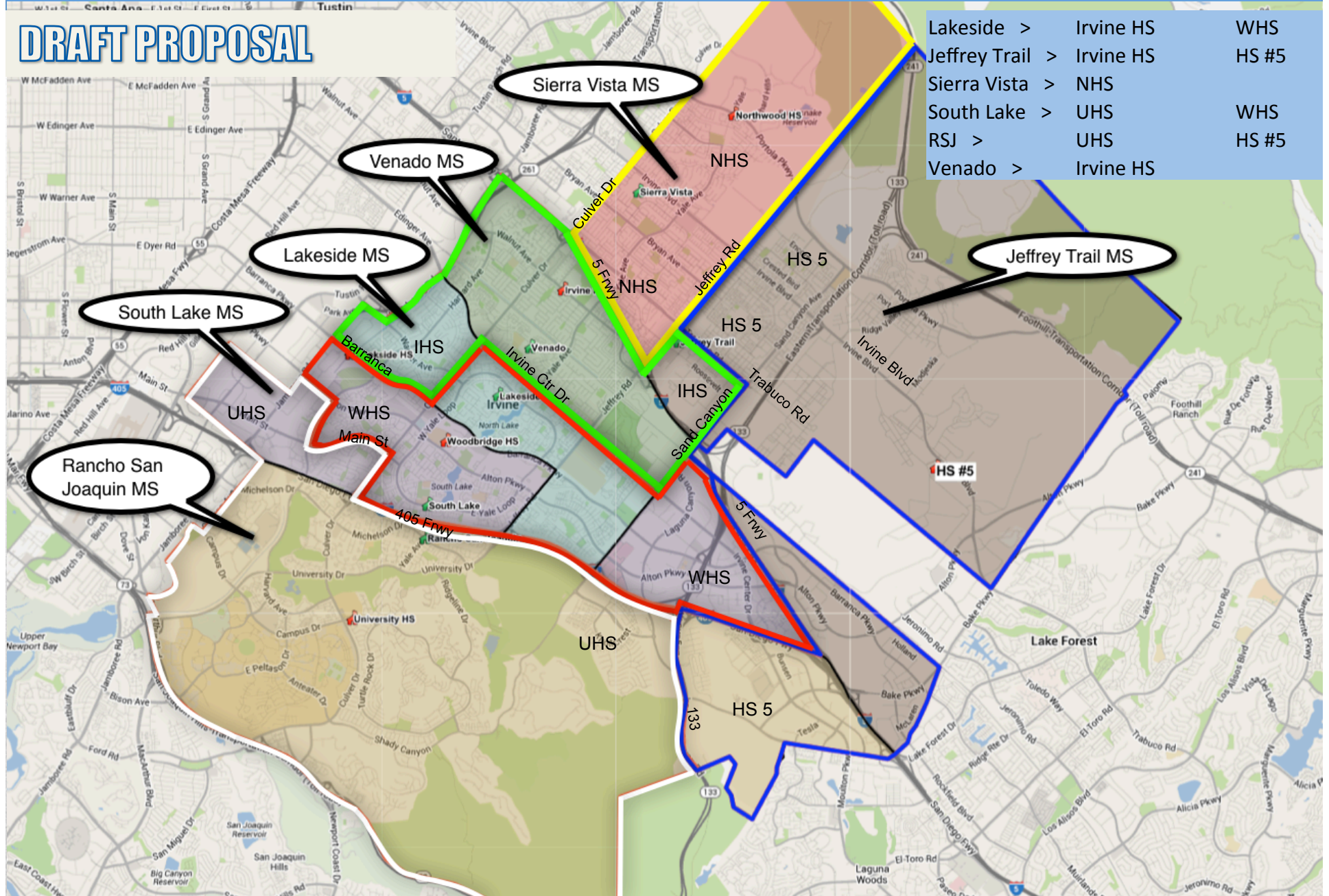

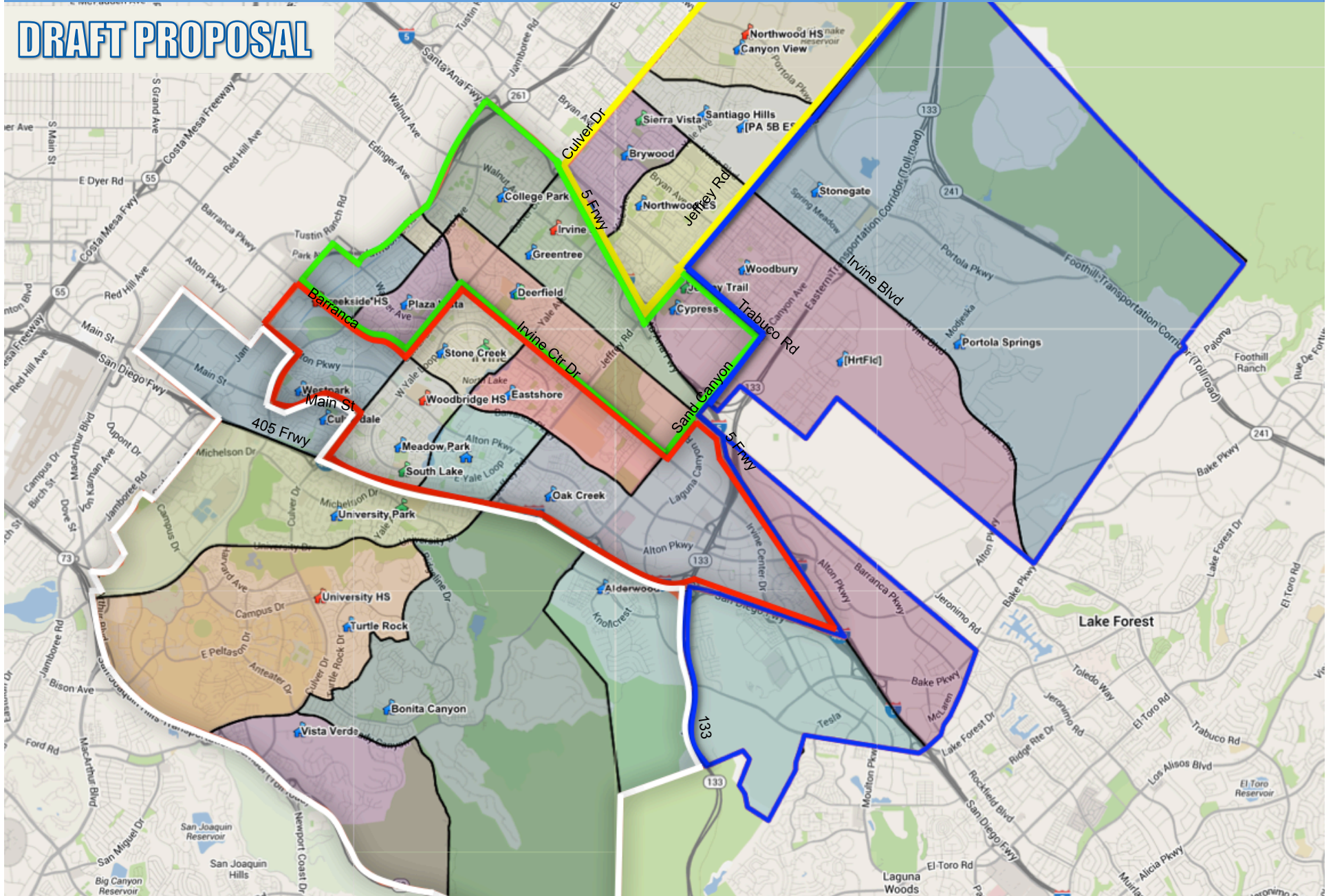

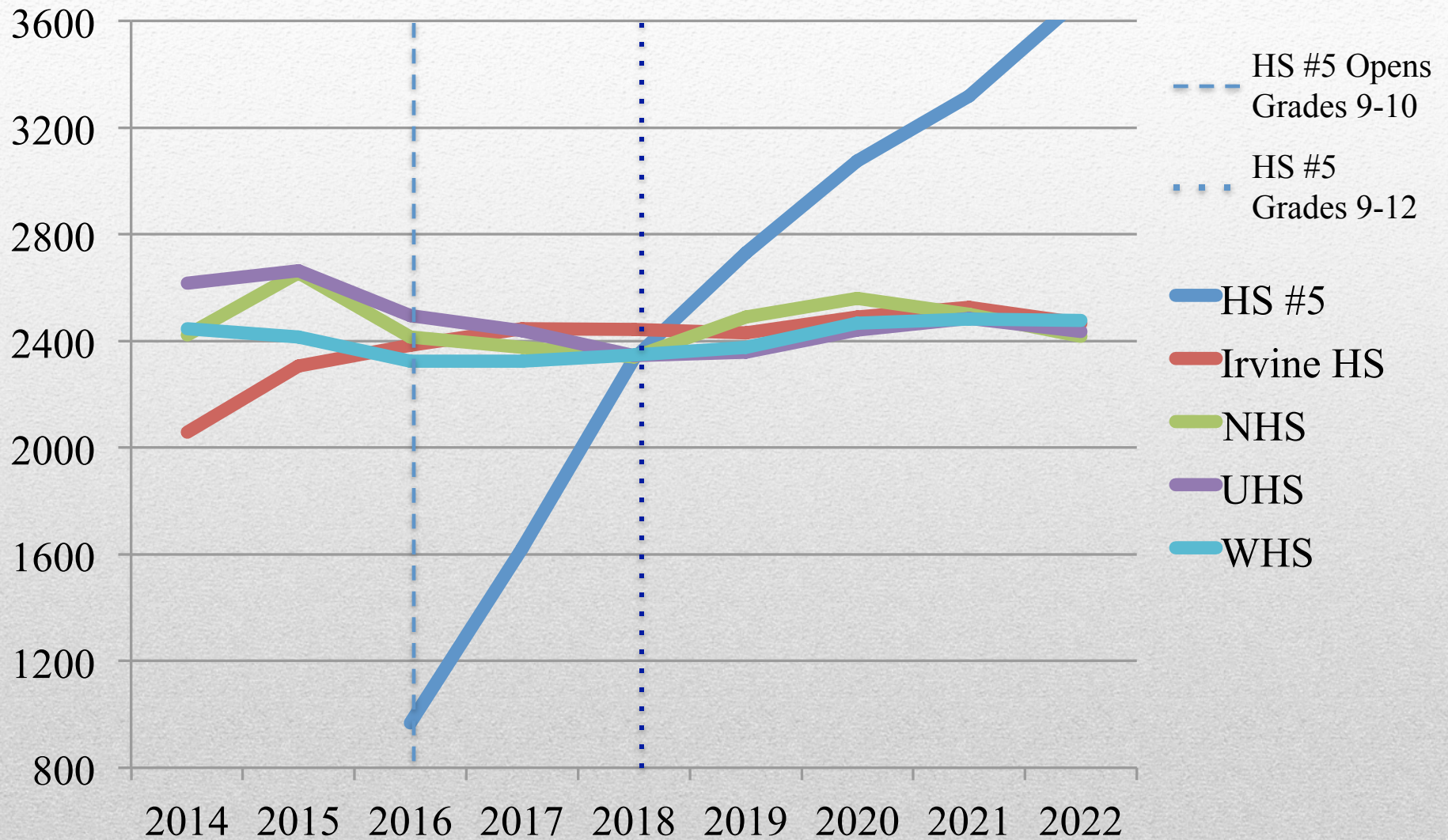

HS #5 Opening Year Grades

The Boundary Advisory Committee and Steering Committee proposal:

1. HS #5 open with 9th and 10th grades to insure a viable student enrollment at the new high school in 2016 .
 2. Students entering 9th and 10th grade in 2016 and who reside in HS #5's attendance area be required to enroll at and attend HS #5.
 3. Students entering 9th grade in 2016 and who reside in the new boundaries for Irvine, Northwood, University and Woodbridge high schools be required to enroll in these schools based on the new boundaries.
-

DRAFT of implementation and transition of students to the new high school boundaries beginning Fall 2016

1. **All 11th and 12th grade students** continue to attend the high school where they were enrolled during school year 2015-16 through completion of high school.
2. **New 11th and 12th grade students** to IUSD enroll at IHS, NHS, UHS or WHS based on their residence in the new high school boundaries. Until HS #5 serves 11th and then 12th grade, new 11th and 12th grade students who reside in HS #5's boundary attend IHS, NHS, UHS, or WHS based on school boundaries for school year 2015-16.
3. **New 10th grade students to IUSD** are required to attend an IUSD high school based on their residence in the new high school boundaries.
4. **All 10th grade students who reside inside HS #5's** school boundary are required to attend HS #5. A 10th grade student with an older sibling attending another IUSD high school in 2016-17 may request and be approved to attend the same high school, if space permits.
5. **All 10th grade students who reside in a high school boundary other than HS #5's** school boundary AND were in attendance at an IUSD school during school year 2015-16:
 - a) Continue to attend the IUSD high school where they were enrolled as a 9th grade student during school year 2015-16 through completion of high school, OR
 - b) Can request and enroll at the high school newly assigned to their residence based on 2016-17 boundaries, if space permits. These requests would be addressed prior to the 1-1 school choice process.
6. **All 9th grade students** are required to attend the IUSD high school based on their place of residence in the **new** high school boundaries approved for school year 2016-17. A 9th grade student with an older sibling attending another IUSD high school in 2016-17 may request and be approved to attend the same high school, if space permits.
7. **Current School Choice based on lottery and a 1 for 1 exchange** will remain available.
8. All other district transfer policies and procedures remain in place to address parent and student requests for school placement.
