a. Irvine Public Schools Foundation

Keegan Bell, Executive Vice President for the Irvine Public Schools Foundation (IPSF), reported on IPSF's dedication to adjusting programs and fundraising plans to meet the needs of the community. The summer school program served 2,500 students completely online. Upcoming, November 11 is the IPSF Enrichment day, which will be a half day of in-person classes for students in grades K-8. In addition, in November, IPSF will commence enrollment into the winter ACE Classes which will continue to offer online and some in-person classes at schools with high interest. Last Friday, was IPSF's Giving Day, where residents turned "Irvine Orange" to show their support and help kick of the annual donation campaign. A video showcase of community members participating in Giving Day was shown. Keegan thanked everyone for their support and noted the campaign goal is to raise \$250,000 to support students and the campaign is well on its way.

8. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Walker reported that students have been back to in-person instruction for five weeks now, and it has been going well. The work by our schools and staff continues to be exemplary. We continue to learn lessons and design new instructional strategies to meet this different way of providing instruction. Everyone's adaptability, resilience and commitment has been inspiring, as our team has strived to keep our commitment to provide the highest educational experience we can envision, while remaining in accordance with laws and safety guidance from expert agencies. We continue to work with CSEA and ITA on ways to support staff. The District has been researching temperature readers. The CDC does not recommend temperature checks. The primary concern is to not increase exposure to staff. We are reviewing different products and have heard from other districts that the temperature readers are not always accurate. As one of the first districts to open to in-person instruction at all grade levels in the state, the District's COVID dashboard is the model for most school districts. There is only one district that is using cumulative totals; however, there is concern that the cumulative totals can be misunderstood for the current number of cases. Irvine's case rates continue to be low. The Orange County Health Care Agency continues to be a valuable resource and partner. In closing, to dispel internet rumors, he reported the IUSD Virtual Academy master agreement parents are asked to sign is to secure funding from the state and is a required audit item, it does not change the instructional program. Again, he urged members of the community to visit the IUSD.org website for accurate information.
