

Who are the adults served at IATP?




All students, 18 - 22 who live in Irvine and leave high school with a certificate of completion and continue to demonstrate the need for transition services.



LEVEL 1

SUPPORT FOR ALL

Various state and local agencies provide an array of support resources, tools, and voluntary technical assistance that all LEAs may use to improve student performance at the LEA and school level and narrow gaps in performance among student groups across the LCFF priorities.



LEVEL 2

DIFFERENTIATED ASSISTANCE

County Superintendents, the California Department of Education, and the California Collaborative for Educational Excellence provide differentiated assistance by working with school districts to address identified performance gaps among student



LEVEL 3

INTENSIVE INTERVENTION

The Superintendent of Public Instruction may require more intensive supports for local education agencies (LEAs) and/or schools with persistent performance issues and a lack of improvement over a specified time period.


