SAFETY PREPAREDNESS EFFORTS

Layered Approach



Simplest and Effective Safety Protocols

Locked Exterior Door = Secured Exterior Door

- IUSD Upgraded Exterior Door Locks Doors Now Able to Lock From Inside
- Installation of "Peep Holes" on Exterior Doors

As determined by the administration and appropriate to the site, doors from the outside that access classrooms and main buildings other than the office and main entrance shall be kept locked to insure that all visitors enter through the office (IUSD Administrative Regulation 5142).





- ✓ Development of an All-Hazard School Safety Assessment Plan
- ✓ School Safety Assessment Plan to include:
 - Evaluation of IUSD's Prevention, Protection, and Mitigation Efforts
 - Evaluation of IUSD's Preparedness Efforts
 - Evaluation of IUSD's Security Technology
 - Evaluation of Threats and Vulnerabilities
 - Evaluation of Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) (Natural Surveillance; Territorial; Natural Access Control)
