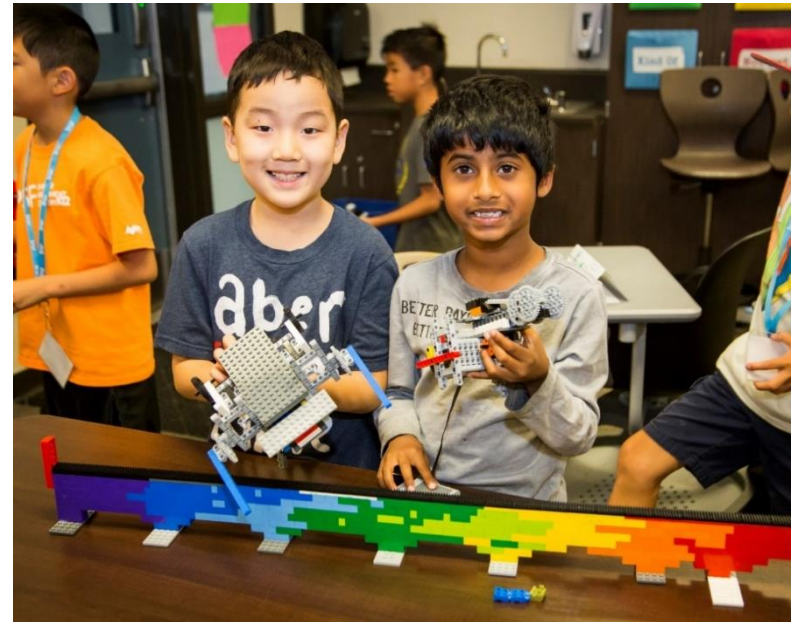
IPSF Overview

- Founded in 1996
- IPSF is not IUSD. We are a private non-profit 501(c)(3)
- Led by a professional staff
- Directed by volunteer Board of Trustees
- Donated \$80 million to IUSD in donations and program support since 1996
- Funding supports every school – creating equity between schools

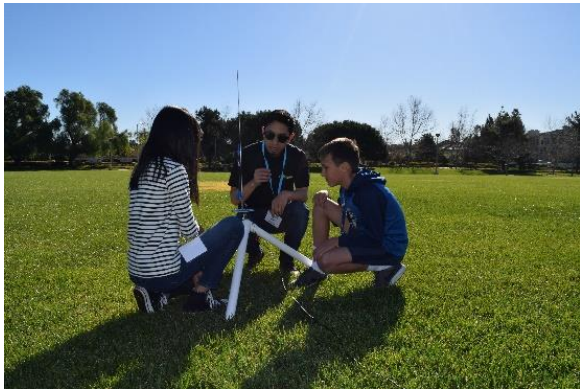
AFTERSCHOOL CLASSROOM ENRICHMENT

2018-2019 RECAP

- 7,600 Enrollments
- Programs at 26 Elementary and 3 Middle Schools
- 700 classes
- Provided 192 need-based scholarships
