Middle School Officer



- Teaches the Students Empowered at Middle School (SEAMS) curriculum
- Special needs students included
- Taught at every middle school in the city

SEAMS Training Curriculum

- 6-week Lesson Plans
 - Working as Allies (friendships)
 - Digital Citizenship (internet safety)
 - Bullying
 - Empathy
 - Assertive Speech (developing confidence)
 - Stress Management

School Resource Officers

- Assigned to the seven public high schools in Irvine
- Work with school administration to keep each campus safe
- Liaison between IPD and schools
- Mentor, teach, guide students as appropriate
- Maintain strong relationships with students, family, and staff
- Investigate juvenile-related incidents on/off campus

Youth Services and Special Needs Students

- Establish contact on campus
 - D.A.R.E., SEAMS, during lunch, other opportunities
- Educate students about police interactions
- Enroll students in IPD's Return Home Registry (RHR)
- Teach vocational skills
- Resource for schools and families

Officer Training

- Basic six month academy training
- 16-week Field Training Program
- Advanced training every trimester
- Briefing training every shift

- ADHD awareness
- Mental health awareness
- Crisis Intervention Training
- Tactical Communications
