

Dear Parents and Students:

The Irvine Unified School District is excited to offer its annual Middle School Summer School program for grades 7-8 at Sierra Vista Middle School and Venado Middle School. The Extended Learning Program will run from June 13th to July 3rd. Classes will be held Monday through Friday from 8:30am to 11:30am. The Math Bridge Course will run from June 4th to June 29th and will meet for six in-person class sessions at Sierra Vista Middle School. Additionally, the Bridge student and a parent must attend at least one of the Online Bridge orientation nights: Thursday, May 24th or Wednesday, May 30th at 6:00pm.

Registration materials for Extended Learning will be sent home to eligible students. Parents and students are encouraged to discuss summer school enrollment with their counselors, paying careful attention to the information noted in the 2018 Summer School Course Catalog. Math Bridge Course Registration will take place at Sierra Vista Middle School on May 7th to 10th from 4-5:00pm. Only eligible students may register for the Bridge course.

As you are aware, a recent legal settlement prohibits districts from charging fees to enroll in summer school. While some districts have opted to cut their summer programs entirely, the Irvine Unified School District is seeking to preserve this valuable opportunity by asking for donations from participating families. Below each course description in the catalog, you will find a "suggested donation" amount to help cover the cost of the instructor, materials and facilities.

Please know that a donation is not required to enroll, and families that choose to contribute may do so at any amount. Our goal is to offer each of these courses, and your donation will help support this goal. Insufficient enrollment and/ or insufficient funding could result in course cancellations. In previous summers multiple courses were <u>cancelled</u> due to insufficient funding. Families that contributed to these canceled courses had their donations and registration forms shredded the week following registration. These courses, as well as a variety of others, will be offered again with the hopes of sufficient donations to fund the program in its entirety.

IUSD's Summer School program presents an incredible opportunity for our students, whether they're pursuing remediation, enrichment or acceleration. As such, we're hoping our funding model is sufficient enough to run all of our course offerings and satisfy the needs of every family.

How to Register for the MS Math Bridge Course

Students are eligible for the Middle School 2018 Summer School Math Bridge course session **PENDING** meeting 2 of the 3 criteria below:

- (1) Grade of A in all trimesters of your current math course
- (2) Appraisal of student readiness for acceleration
- (3) Score of 85% or above on the end of course assessment for your current math course

Course Description: This course is designed for students recommended for and electing to accelerate their math pathway within Irvine Unified School District. This course will provide in-depth instruction, practice, and assessment for standards needed to bridge to an accelerated math pathway.

Course Information: The MS Math Summer Bridge meets for six in-person class sessions at Sierra Vista Middle School (see dates below). Students work independently from home on a computer during the week. *Parent and student must attend at least one of the Online Bridge orientation nights: Thursday, May 24th or Wednesday, May 30th at 6:00pm at Creekside Education Center.*

 - o Monday, June 11th
 - o Monday, June 18th
 - o Monday, June 25th
- Midterm Friday, June 15th
- End of Course Exam Friday, June 29th

Dropping of Classes

You may find that your student no longer needs or wants to take a Summer School course. Please follow the guidelines below to ensure they are dropped from the class.

- If you are dropping a class before the Summer School session you must email your request to
 <u>kylenecarter@iusd.org</u>. Refunds will only be given until May 25, 2018. Requests to drop a course after May 25th
 will result in the class being removed from the schedule but the donation check will be processed.
- If you are dropping a class during the Summer School session you must do so at the front desk at the campus.

Text Books

Text books will be distributed the first day of class by the instructor as needed. Students are responsible for returning their text books to their instructor in a useable condition. Students who return text books that are damaged, or fail to return a text book, will be required to purchase a replacement.

Students who choose to drop the class prior to the last day are responsible for returning the book back to the instructor.



Absences: Students are expected to commit to the full term of Summer School.

- Extended Learning Program: Students are allowed no more than three absences; upon the fourth absence a student will be dropped. If a student arrives more than 30 minutes late to class, this too will count as an absence.
- Math Bridge Course: Students are allowed no more than 1 absence of the in-person class sessions, including mid-term and/or final exam dates, (with prior approval) for a Blended Online class; upon the second absence a student will be dropped. If a student arrives more than 30 minutes late to class this too will count as an absence.

<u>Tardies</u>: Three tardies to a class are equivalent to one absence. Tardy marks will be combined with absences to determine if a student is dropped from the course (ex. 3 tardy marks and 3 absences will result in student being dropped).

THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY

Cell Phone Policy

Students may not use their cell phones between the start and finish of class. All cell phones must be turned off and kept in backpacks. They must not be visible. Using a cell phone as a clock or saying that it fell out of a pocket is not an excuse to have a cell phone out.

If a student is using a cell phone (ANY OF ITS FUNCTIONS) for any reason during the restricted time, the following consequences will be imposed:

Violation #1

Phone will be confiscated from the student and returned to student at the end of the class period. Administrator will contact parent.

Violation #2

Parent conference. Student dropped from Summer School course(s).

THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY

IRVINE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR LOST, STOLEN OR BROKEN CELL PHONES AND WILL NOT PAY FOR PHONES THAT ARE LOST, STOLEN OR MISPLACED BY STAFF MEMBERS AFTER CONFISCA- TION (Board Policy 5131.6).

Academic Honesty Policy

Academic honesty in the classroom means that all students do their own work on assignments, homework, and examinations. The work completed by students is used to determine the grades given in courses. Unauthorized assistance from other students or student aides also is considered a violation of the Academic Honesty Policy.

It shall be the judgment and responsibility of teachers to determine whether an academic dishonesty violation has occurred. Students in violation of the policy will be immediately dropped from the summer school class.

EXAMPLES OF VIOLATIONS INCLUDE (but are not -limited to):

- 1. A student looks on another student's paper or talks during an examination.
- 2. A student helps another student cheat on an examination, assignment or project.
- 3. A student uses unauthorized materials (notes, calculators, etc.) during an examination or on a paper/project.
- 4. A student furnishes either the contents of an examination or an actual exam from an earlier class period to students taking the exam later.
- 5. A student copies another student's homework.
- 6. A student turns in another person's work as his/her own.
- 7. A student conspires to cheat or help other students to cheat on an examination, assignment or project.
- 8. A student uses another student's computer desk/data disk.
- 9. A student cheats on an examination by preconceived acts, such as stealing an examination.
- 10. A student makes changes on graded work, a grade sheet or any school record.

Length/Credit: 3 weeks

Prerequisite: Remediation Only:.

Suggested Donation: \$100

This course is designed for students needing additional support in mathematics. Incoming 7th grade students who need extended learning opportunities in order to successfully enter grade 7 mathematics will be registered for this course.

397 GRADE 8 MATH EXTENDED LEARNING

Length/Credit: 3 weeks

Prerequisite: Remediation Only:.

Suggested Donation: \$100

This course is designed for students needing additional support in mathematics. Incoming 8th grade students who need extended learning opportunities in order to successfully enter grade 8 mathematics will be registered for this course.

052 MIDDLE SCHOOL MATH BRIDGE COURSE

Length/Credit: 4 weeks

Prerequisite: Selection as a candidate to move to the accelerated middle school math pathway as defined by IUSD's placement criteria.

Availability: This course is available to incoming 8th grade students who meet eligibility requirements. This course is offered as a hybrid online course.

Suggested Donation: \$185

This course is designed for students recommended for and electing to accelerate their math pathway within Irvine Unified School District. This course will provide in-depth instruction, practice, and assessment for standards needed to bridge to an accelerated math pathway. This course will cover five units of study.



195 7th GRADE LANGUAGE ARTS EXTENDED LEARNING

Length/Credit: 3 weeks

Prerequisite: Remediation Only:

Suggested Donation: \$100

This course is designed for students needing additional support in language arts. Incoming 7th grade students who need extended learning opportunities in language arts will be enrolled in this course.

195 8th GRADE LANGUAGE ARTS EXTENDED LEARNING

Length/Credit: 3 weeks

Prerequisite: Remediation Only: Suggested Donation: \$100

This course is designed for students needing additional support in language arts. Incoming 8th grade students who need extended learning opportunities in language arts will be enrolled in this course.

9995 ENGLISH LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT 1

Length/Credit: 3 weeks

Prerequisite: Remediation Only: Suggested Donation: \$100
